TEACHING AND MENTORING EXPERIENCE

PSYC 3375 Psychology in the Classroom

Course examines basic psychological concepts including how children develop cognitively, learning styles, , how to address individual needs of each learner, the influence of the learner’s beliefs on motivation, culture and cognitive/social/emotional development as applied to the classroom setting- with an emphasis on elementary and adolescent development.

PSYC 1305 Introduction to Psychology

This course is a broad introduction to the field of psychology. Students explore the key figures, diverse theoretical perspectives, and research findings that have shaped some of the major areas of contemporary psychology. This course also examines the research methods used by psychologists across these areas to study the origins and variations in human behavior.

PSYC 3335 Counseling Skills and Techniques

Introduction to counseling theory; practice of basic counseling skills such as paraphrasing, empathizing, reflecting and clarifying, summarizing, probing, challenging, goal setting, problem solving, and applying ethical and legal standards.

PSYC 2355 Lifespan Development

Course examines the physical, social, cognitive, personality and cultural forces that shape each stage of development, from birth to the end of life.

PSYC 3341 Physiological Psychology

Course examines principles governing neuronal activity, the relationship between brain activity and subjective experience, the role of neurotransmitter systems in memory and motivational processes, and the presumed brain dysfunctions that give rise to mental illnesses like schizophrenia and depression.

PSYC 5314 Independent Research

Experiential learning course in which students assist in psychological research by conducting a research project. Duties involve research design, literature review, data collection, and statistical analysis.

Duties include:

- Create and teach courses on physiological psychology human development and educational psychology.
- Instruct students on psychological concepts and skills with a focus on relevant applications of those skills.
- Devise and supervise research projects in the fields of biopsychology, development and educational psychology to be carried out by students, and report significant findings through publications
